

#### TRANSLATIONS DRAWINGS

The *Translations* drawings were created by intermediate and advanced drawing students in ARTS 201/301, *Drawing into Painting: A Contemporary Approach to the Figure*.

Each student selected a piece included in the *Collage* performance that compelled them and embodied it through movement. The embodied responses were videotaped, providing the basis for gestural figure drawings.

Students also made ink from natural materials that, in combination with black ink and watercolor, evoked the musical compositions' mood through color.
