BIOGRAPHIES

STEVEN ZOPFI is director of choral activities and professor of music at University of Puget, where he oversees four choirs, teaches conducting and applied voice, and conducts the award-winning Adelphian Concert Choir. Prior to his appointment at Puget Sound, he served on the faculties of Penn State University, the University of Washington, and Pacific Lutheran University. Choirs under his direction have been invited to sing at the local and regional conventions of the American Choral Director's Association, the National Association for Music Education, the Society of Composers Inc., the Colorado Early Music Society, and other professional organizations.

A native of New Jersey, Zopfi has a bachelor's degree in music education from the Hartt School of Music, a master's degree in conducting from the University of California, Irvine, and a doctor of musical arts degree in choral conducting from the University of Colorado. He taught in public schools in Vermont and New York, where he also served as Vermont State President of the American Choral Directors Association and as an executive board member of the Vermont Music Educators Association. Since coming to the Pacific Northwest in 2001, he has remained active in professional organizations, serving as Chair of Collegiate Activities for WA ACDA and NW ACDA. He is in constant demand as a conductor, adjudicator, and clinician. In 2015, he was named the Outstanding Choral Conductor of the year by WA ACDA.

Zopfi served as the artistic director and conductor of the Portland Symphonic Choir from 2003–2018, the official chorus of the Oregon Symphony Orchestra. Zopfi led the Oregon Symphony in performances of Mozart's Mass in C Minor, Stravinsky's Symphony of Psalms, and music by Beethoven, Bach, and Wagner. Critics have hailed his work as "magical" and "superb." Zopfi has prepared choruses for Carlos Kalmar, Bernard Labadie, Alastair Willis, Murray Sidlin, Jean Marie Zeitouni, and Peter Schickele. As a singer, he has sung for many leading conductors including Robert Shaw and Sir David Wilcocks. He has performed with the Prague Philharmonic, the Colorado Symphony, the New Jersey Symphony, and the Pazardzhik Symphony; and is the founder and past artistic director of the Foundling Hospital Singers, the Boulder Schola Cantorum, the Grace Chamber Orchestra, and the Portland Sinfonietta.

JONAH HEINEN is adjunct choral director at the University of Puget Sound where he conducts the Dorian Singers and Chorale. A native of Minnesota, he received his Bachelor of Music in vocal music education at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities, and his Master of Music in choral conducting at the University of Oregon. Prior to moving to the Pacific Northwest, Heinen served as vocal music director at Faribault High School in Faribault, Minn. There, he directed multiple choirs, served as the music director for the spring musical production, and advocated for LGBTQ+ students by co-advising the school's Gender-Sexuality Alliance, served on the building's equity committee, and presented districtwide professional development sessions. In addition to high school teaching, Heinen also conducted with Northfield Youth Choirs, directing Anima, the middle school-aged girls' choir. As an active member of Minnesota's American Choral Director's Association chapter, he served as program co-chair for ACDA-MN's state conference.

At the University of Oregon, under the mentorship of Dr. Sharon J. Paul, Heinen served as rotating conductor of Repertoire Singers, assistant conductor of the University of Oregon Chamber Choir, and guest conductor of University Singers. Highlights include conducting Benjamin Britten's *A Ceremony of Carols* with dancers and harp, and was a featured student conductor on the University of Oregon Chamber Choir's Spain Tour in May 2022.

A sought-after clinician, Heinen recently has worked with the South Salem High School Symphonic Choir and the Eugene Gay Men's Chorus. As a tenor, he has sung most recently with the Oregon Bach Festival, Eugene Symphony Chorus and Eugene Opera Chorus.

WILL COOPER '22, MAT '23 is a graduate at the University of Puget Sound with a degree in choral music education, and is currently a part of Puget Sound's MAT program. He is currently in the Adelphian Concert Choir as the assistant choir director, as well as the bass section leader.

During his undergrad, Cooper has sung with the Adelphians for four years, and Voci d'Amici for three years. He has taken four years of voice lessons with Dr. Steven Zopfi. He has been a part of multiple opera theater productions, including last year's production of *The Pirates of Penzance*, portraying the role, "The Pirate King". He also has been involved in a cappella here at Puget Sound, as he is the former president and musical director of "Timberfolk" a cappella.

Once he receives his master's degree, Cooper plans to move his teaching career toward the secondary level of schooling, as he wants to become a high school choir director.

SHEILA BRISTOW is a church musician, collaborative keyboardist, and composer living in Tacoma, Wash. She holds degrees in music composition and organ performance from Cornish College of the Arts and the University of Washington. Ms. Bristow serves as organist and choirmaster at Episcopal Church of the Redeemer, Kenmore, and keyboardist for Harmonia Orchestra & Chorus. She is also an affiliate artist at Pacific Lutheran University, where she works with the opera program and performs on collaborative recitals.

JIEUN YUN serves as a staff pianist for the University of Puget Sound School of Music in the choral area. She earned her doctorate at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary where she has also served as an adjunct faculty member. Dr. Yun currently serves as organist for First Baptist Church in Tacoma and as a rehearsal pianist for Tacoma Youth Chorus. She has been a collaborative pianist with the Orchestral Recital Series.

ADELPHIAN CONCERT CHOIR

Founded in 1932, the Adelphian Concert Choir is one of the signature groups of the university and recognized as one of the Pacific Northwest's most acclaimed ensembles. For more than 80 years, this auditioned choir has sustained a level of choral excellence that has brought accolades from audiences in Canada, in Europe, and on the West Coast. It has appeared at the state, regional, and national conventions of both the American Choral Directors Association and the Music Educators National Conference. The Adelphians consistently receive the highest acclaim for standards in repertoire, interpretation, and musicianship.

DORIAN SINGERS

Dorian Singers, conducted by Jonah Heinen, is an auditioned, treble-voice chamber choir. Now in its third decade, it is widely recognized throughout the Pacific Northwest as one of the region's leading treble ensembles. Members of Dorian Singers are strongly committed to learning choral music through a combined understanding of vocal technique, sound production, and ensemble mastery. They represent a wide range of class years and majors at Puget Sound, and are engaged in numerous activities both on and off campus, including serving as hosts of the annual Northwest High School Women's Choral Festival. In 2010, Dorian Singers were featured at the Society of Composers regional conference, and in March 2012, the group made its first appearance at the Northwest American Choral Directors Association convention.

VOCI D'AMICI

This a cappella 16-voice ensemble performs in holiday concerts every December. Its repertoire ranges from the Renaissance to the 21st century.

CHORALE

Open to the entire campus community, Chorale is a non-auditioned mixed ensemble that meets twice weekly. Through repertoire drawn from a multiplicity of style periods and genres, including world choral music, members establish a musical foundation of vocal technique, music theory, and sight singing.
