

JEFFERY N. LUND is recognized throughout the Pacific Northwest for his involvement in music education and music performance. Active as an educator, teacher, and performer, he works tirelessly to broaden appreciation for the artistic traditions of western art music in those who might be less familiar with "classical" music. Currently, he teaches percussion-related courses at University of Puget Sound as affiliate artist in percussion, and teaches general music course at Tacoma Community College, where he is an adjunct professor. Along with his teaching and performing, Mr. Lund is the music director and conductor of the Rainier Symphony.

Mr. Lund holds bachelor and master degrees in percussion performance, and a master's degree in orchestral conducting. Additionally, he is a Liberace Scholar, a Hubbard Scholar, and an endorsed artist with Marimba One.
