



## Black Student Union, *One More* Scholarship 2024-25 Academic Year

The *One More* scholarship was created in 2014 by the Black Student Union of Puget Sound in order to alleviate some of the barriers to pursuing higher education for fellow students of color by providing financial support. The *One More* scholarship provides a Logger Store gift card to recipients for books and technology. Students can use the gift card for textbooks, electronics, or other classroom necessities available at the Logger Store or ordered via support from the Logger Store staff. Scholarship recipients are expected to actively participate in the Black Student Union throughout the academic year.

While the exact scholarship amounts have yet to be determined, in the past we have awarded six scholarships with an average amount of \$1,000 per student. Previous recipients are eligible to apply, however priority is given to new applicants. Previous recipients must submit a new application each year. Posse Scholars as well as students whose demonstrated financial need is being met with the TPS or Access commitment are not eligible, as Puget Sound scholarships must go towards unmet need.

Eligible recipients are current Puget Sound students who will be enrolled for the 2024-25 academic year and demonstrate financial need with an emphasis on applicants who identify as Black and/or African American (including biracial and multiracial black students).
