BIOGRAPHIES

STEVEN ZOPFI is director of choral activities and professor of music at the University of Puget Sound where he oversees four choirs, teaches conducting, applied voice, and conducts the award-winning Adelphian Concert Choir. Prior to his appointment at Puget Sound, he served on the faculties of Penn State University, the University of Washington and Pacific Lutheran University. Choirs under his direction have been invited to sing at the local and regional conventions of the American Choral Director's Association, the National Association for Music Education, the Society of Composers, Inc., the Colorado Early Music Society, and other professional organizations.

A native of New Jersey, Zopfi has a bachelor's degree in music education from the Hartt School of Music, a Master of Music degree in conducting from the University of California, Irvine, and Doctor of Musical Arts in choral conducting from the University of Colorado. He taught in the public schools in Vermont and New York, where he also served as Vermont State President of the American Choral Directors Association and an executive board member of the Vermont Music Educators Association. Since coming to the Pacific Northwest in 2001, he continued to remain active in professional organizations serving as Chair of Collegiate Activities for WA ACDA and NW ACDA. He is in constant demand as a conductor, adjudicator, and clinician. In 2015, he was named the Outstanding Choral Conductor of the year by WA ACDA.

Zopfi served as artistic director of the Portland Symphonic Choir from 2003 to 2018, the official chorus of the Oregon Symphony Orchestra. He led the Oregon Symphony in performances of Mozart's Mass in C Minor, Stravinsky's Symphony of Psalms, and music by Beethoven, Bach, and Wagner. Critics have hailed his work as "magical" and "superb." Zopfi has prepared choruses for Carlos Kalmar, Bernard Labadie, Alastair Willis, Murray Sidlin, Jean Marie Zeitouni, and Peter Schickele. As a singer, he has sung for many leading conductors including Robert Shaw and Sir David Wilcocks. He has performed with the Prague Philharmonic, the Colorado Symphony, the New Jersey Symphony, and the Pazardzhik Symphony and is the founder and past artistic director of the Foundling Hospital Singers, the Boulder Schola Cantorum, the Grace Chamber Orchestra, and The Portland Sinfonietta.

Zopfi is the founder and artistic director of the Tacoma Bach Festival.

JONAH HEINEN is an affiliate artist at the University of Puget Sound, where he conducts the Dorian Singers and Chorale. A native of Minnesota, he received his Bachelor of Music in vocal music education at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities, and his Master of Music in choral conducting at the University of Oregon. Prior to moving to the Pacific Northwest, Jonah served as vocal music director at Faribault High School in Faribault, Minn. There, he directed multiple choirs, served as the music director for the spring musical production, and advocated for LGBTQ+ students by co-advising the school's Gender-Sexuality Alliance, served on the building's equity committee, and presented district-wide professional development sessions. In addition to high school teaching, Jonah also conducted with Northfield Youth Choirs, directing Anima, the middle school-aged girls' choir. As an active member of Minnesota's American Choral Director's Association chapter, he served as program co-chair for ACDA-MN's State Conference.

At the University of Oregon, under the mentorship of Sharon J. Paul, Heinen served as rotating conductor of Repertoire Singers, assistant conductor of the University of Oregon Chamber Choir, and guest conductor of University Singers. Highlights include a collaborative performance of Benjamin Britten's A Ceremony of Carols with dancers and harp, and he was a featured student conductor on the University of Oregon Chamber Choir's Spain Tour in May 2022.

A sought-after clinician, Heinen works regularly with schools in the Seattle-Tacoma region and adjudicates at both regional- and state-level contests. As a tenor, he currently sings with Choral Arts Northwest in Seattle, and has recently sung with the Oregon Bach Festival, Eugene Symphony Chorus, and Eugene Opera Chorus. Heinen is also a tour manager with ACFEA Tour Consultants.

JIEUN YUN serves as a staff pianist for the University of Puget Sound School of Music in the choral area. She earned her doctorate at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary where she has also served as an adjunct faculty member. Yun currently serves as organist for First Baptist Church in Tacoma and as a rehearsal pianist for Tacoma Youth Chorus. She has been a collaborative pianist with the Orchestral Recital Series.

JINSHIL YI'14 is an avid collaborative pianist in high demand throughout the Tacoma/Seattle area. She has appeared in concerts with Northwest Sinfonietta Artistic Partner David Lockington, soprano Christina Kowalski, mezzo-soprano Dawn Padula, and baritone Ryan Bede. Since 2016, Yi has served as staff accompanist at the University of Puget Sound, working extensively with Steven Zopfi, Kathryn Lehmann, and Ed Hughes on the acclaimed Adelphian Concert Choir, Dorians, and Chorale.

A heartfelt sacred music enthusiast, Yi loves expressing her faith through her work as pianist and organist for two churches in Lakewood, Wash. In addition to being on staff as a pianist for Tacoma Youth Chorus and Charles Wright Academy, she regularly collaborates with other Tacoma schools, choirs, and private music studios for music festivals, competitions, and concerts. Both her solo and collaborative playing have been broadcast on the radio, most recently on 98.1 KING FM following a concert tour of western Washington.

Yi serves as managing director for Second City Chamber Series and is a soprano in the Symphony Tacoma Voices. She holds three undergraduate degrees cum laude from the University of Puget Sound in music, biochemistry, and politics and government with an international relations emphasis.

ADELPHIAN CONCERT CHOIR

Founded in 1932, the Adelphian Concert Choir is one of the signature groups of the university and recognized as one of the Pacific Northwest's most acclaimed ensembles. For more than 90 years, this auditioned choir has sustained a level of choral excellence that has brought accolades from audiences in Canada, in Europe, and on the West Coast. It has appeared at the state, regional, and national conventions of both the American Choral Directors Association and the Music Educators National Conference. The Adelphians consistently receive the highest acclaim for standards in repertoire, interpretation, and musicianship.

VOCI D'AMICI

Selected from the membership of the Adelphian Concert Choir, Voci d'Amici is a non-conducted vocal ensemble that focuses on vocal jazz, pop, and a cappella music. They sing at the Fall Festival of Choirs and Winterfest concerts and tour with the Adelphian Concert Choir in the spring.
