BIOGRAPHIES

JONAH HEINEN is an affiliate artist at the University of Puget Sound where he conducts the Puget Sound Singers. A native of Minnesota, he received his Bachelor of Music in vocal music education at the University of Minnesota- Twin Cities, and his Master of Music in choral conducting at the University of Oregon. Prior to moving to the Pacific Northwest, Heinen served as vocal music director at Faribault High School in Faribault, Minn. There, he directed multiple choirs, served as the music director for the spring musical production, and advocated for LGBTQ+ students by co-advising the school's Gender-Sexuality Alliance, served on the building's equity committee, and presented district-wide professional development sessions. In addition to high school teaching, Heinen also conducted with Northfield Youth Choirs, directing Anima, the middle school-aged girls' choir. As an active member of Minnesota's American Choral Director's Association chapter, he served as concert cochair for ACDA-MN's State Conference.

At the University of Oregon, under the mentorship of Dr. Sharon J. Paul, Heinen served as rotating conductor of Repertoire Singers, assistant conductor of the University of Oregon Chamber Choir, and guest conductor of University Singers. Highlights include a collaborative performance of Benjamin Britten's A Ceremony of Carols with dancers and harp, and he was a featured student conductor on the University of Oregon Chamber Choir's Spain Tour in May 2022.

A sought-after clinician, Heinen works regularly with schools in the Seattle-Tacoma region, adjudicates at both regional and state-level contests, and presents at conferences, most recently at MN ACDA in November 2024. As a tenor, he is on staff at Epiphany Parish- Seattle and sings with Choral Arts Northwest and the Tacoma Bach Festival Chorus. Recent appearances have included Early Music Hawaii, the Oregon Bach Festival, Eugene Symphony Chorus, and Eugene Opera Chorus. Heinen is also a tour manager with ACFEA Tour Consultants.

JIEUN YUN, D.M.A., is an accomplished organist, pianist, and collaborative artist, active in the Tacoma and Seattle areas. She serves as adjunct faculty in Collaborative Piano at the University of Puget Sound School of Music and works as the collaborative pianist for the Bremerton Symphony Chorale. Yun is also the conductor of the Tacoma First Baptist Church Choir and frequently collaborates with churches, choirs, vocalists, instrumentalists, and ensembles. She previously served as adjunct faculty in Worship Leadership and Keyboard Studies at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary (NOBTS), where she earned her Doctor of Musical Arts degree in organ performance under Dr. Carol Britt

and Dr. Michaella Harrison. Her dissertation focused on J.S. Bach's chorale *Wachet auf. ruft uns die Stimme.*

In addition to her academic and professional achievements, Yun received a full scholarship in instrumental music while at NOBTS and worked as the head collaborative pianist for the music division. Passionate about community and musical excellence, she continues to bring energy and dedication to her roles in performance and education.

KYLE HAUGEN, artistic director and conductor, Northwest Repertory Singers, is a versatile musician with experience spanning Baroque organ to musical theater. A native of Tacoma, he earned a Bachelor of Arts in music at the University of Puget Sound (studying organ and voice) and a Master of Sacred Music degree from Luther Seminary in conjunction with St. Olaf College. He was named the second artistic director of Northwest Repertory Singers in 2018 after the retirement of the late Paul Schultz, who founded the ensemble shortly after retiring as director of choral activities at the University of Puget Sound. Haugen is presently the full-time Cantor at Queen Anne Lutheran Church in Seattle where he serves as organist and director of parish ensembles, and he freelances as a choral tenor in the region. Music career highlights include nearly a decade directing high school ensembles with Tacoma Youth Chorus and participation as a choral tenor in two landmark recordings of Renaissance choral works at Boston's Church of the Advent, where he also was also selected as tenor soloist for the premiere of Daniel Pinkham's Missa Brevis. He is a published composer of choral and keyboard music with Augsburg Fortress and Pavane Publishing, earning recognition on regional and national American Choral Directors Association lists and as "Editor's Choice" by one of the leading national music retailers in the United States. Since 2000 his music has been performed, recorded, and broadcast on radio and television. www.kvle-haugen.com

MARJORIE SKREEN, Northwest Repertory Singers collaborative pianist, received the Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Puget Sound and the Master of Music from the University of Washington. Skreen has performed at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. and has appeared as a vocal soloist with the Tacoma Symphony, as a featured artist with the Orpheus Chorus, as a featured piano soloist for the University of Puget Sound Centennial Celebration, and as a vocal soloist for the university's Jacobsen Series featuring music of women composers. She is a member of the Tacoma Chapter Music Teachers Association, where her students have been chosen as convention representatives. Skreen has served Northwest Repertory Singers since its founding in 2001.

Established in fall 2001, the mission of Northwest Repertory Singers (NWRS) is "To lift voices in song: creating art and fostering community through choral music." Rehearsing weekly in Tacoma's Stadium District from September to May, NWRS is one of the premier independent volunteer choral ensembles in the Puget Sound region. Members are selected annually by audition, and each singer comes from a rich musical tradition. Now in its twenty-fourth season, NWRS has built a strong reputation for creative collaboration with artists and groups spanning a variety of musical genres, from Northwest Sinfonietta to The Coats, from Tacoma Youth Chorus to Morten Lauridsen. With nearly one-third of the choir having alumni or career ties to the University of Puget Sound, NWRS is especially delighted to collaborate with the Puget Sound Singers for this evening's concert.
